Council schedules votes for budget, tax rate

The City of The Colony's Preliminary Budget for FY2016-17 is available online for review by the public. A public hearing on the budget was conducted on Tuesday, Aug. 16. The city is proposing a 1/4-cent reduction to the tax rate for next fiscal year. A <u>public hearing on the tax rate</u>, not to exceed .6675 cents per \$100 valuation, will be held during the Sept. 6 regular city council meeting. The Council will formally vote on the budget and tax rate during its Sept. 20 regular meeting.

Main Street Widening Update

Current roadwork associated with the Main Street Widening Project:

• alternate lane closures in the various lanes of north- and southbound FM 423 from Stewarts Creek Road to SH121 for restriping, traffic switch (Aug. 1-31).

Council Happenings

During its recent regular meetings, The Colony City Council:

- approved a resolution establishing rules for the **Pawsome** Playground Dog Park. Included is a rule that states: "The park is for dog play, not child play. Adults are strongly urged not to bring children under 10 years of age to the park, and assume all risks when doing so. Children 15 and under must be accompanied and supervised by an adult." The grand opening for the dog park, located at 4800 East Lake Highlands Drive, is set for 9 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 17;
- scheduled a **public hearing** for Sept. 6 on the Preliminary Service and Assessment Plan for Public Improvement District No. 1;
- conducted a public hearing and voted to set a date of Sept. 20 for adoption of the FY2016-17 Municipal Budget; and,
- conducted a public hearing on the **proposed tax rate** for FY2016 -17, not to exceed .6675 cents per \$100 valuation, and approved the date of Sept. 20 for a vote to establish the tax rate.
