



May Recap

- The 2014 National Travel and Tourism Week kicked off on May 3 and ran through May 10. The purpose of National Travel and Tourism Week is to showcase the importance and impact of travel on jobs and economic growth in The Colony and throughout the United States. Travel and tourism is one of America's largest employers, among the top 10 in 48 states and the District of Columbia. Travel supports small businesses, puts people to work and remains the number one American export. This year's theme, "Travel Effect," set out to prove the benefits of travel. - The Colony CVB distributed the May eBlast featuring Jammin' in the Park, Movies in the Park, Mother's Day lunch at the Tribute and the Mother and Son Luau. The eBlast spotlighted the newly opened Little Caesars Pizza and their hot and ready options. The newsletter also highlighted both lake parks, Stewart Creek Park and Hidden Cove Park as well as related amenities such as Suntex Watersports, Flying and Floating Toys and DFW Surf.
- Throughout the month of May the CVB and the Communications departments continued work on the new website redesign to finalize the design and complete all updates. The staff participated in a training session in order to be able to manage the website in-house in the future.
- The Colony CVB relies on several social media sources to help support its marketing campaign and promote the city and its amenities. One such resource is Trip Advisor. In May The Colony CVB increased the number of The Colony listings found on Trip Advisor by submitting new attractions and reviews. This will be an ongoing process that we hope to encourage our friends and followers to join in. - Director of Communications Diane Baxter toured the city from a helicopter the morning of May 5, providing guidance to a film crew shooting aerial footage of The Colony for a promotional video. Both the helicopter pilot and the cameraman expressed pleasant surprise at all the development and attractions they saw from above.



- At the request of *The Colony Courier-Leader*, the Communications Department has been compiling and editing nearly two dozen Q&A profiles about individual department directors within the city. The first installment appeared in the June 1, 2014, edition, featuring Assistant Police Chief Chris Plemons. Additional profiles will run regularly in the coming weeks, enabling our residents to “put a face with the name,” and learn a little more about the city’s administrative leadership.

- Communications staff members continually work closely with other departments to edit, draft, and/or distribute a variety of press releases relating to city operations and events. Those efforts, among other engagements with local media, have resulted in coverage of:

- * ongoing economic development at the Nebraska Furniture Mart site in a story by *The Dallas Business Journal* dated May 28 and titled, “Nebraska Furniture Mart readying to take DFW by storm;”
- * construction progress and economic impact of the Grandscape development in a story by *The Dallas Business Journal* dated May 23 and titled, “Digging Dallas-Fort Worth: How top 10 major construction projects will change North Texas;”
- * The Colony Fire Department’s efforts battling two structure fires on the same day, one in Carrollton and one in The Colony, on the front page of *The Courier-Leader* published May 11;
- * ongoing events and activities at The Colony Public Library, with emphasis on upcoming summer programs, in a *neighborsgo* Community Leader’s Column by Library Director Joan L. Sveinsson, published May 23;
- * P&Z’s approval of the Courtyard by Marriott and Village at 121 projects, front page of *The Courier-Leader*, published May 18;
- * preparations for the City Manager’s Arts Committee’s presentation of Shakespeare in the Park, front page of *The Courier-Leader* published May 25;
- * the city’s annual mosquito-prevention program;
- * the city’s status as a Playful City USA for the fourth-straight year;
- * pending and ongoing roadwork on Knight Drive;
- * the annual Mother-Son Luau at The Colony Aquatic Park;
- * the annual Health & Info Fair at The Colony Community Center;
- * May’s installment of Movies in the Park; and,
- * the City Manager’s Arts Committee visual arts project, Art Quest.

- Communications staff members recently teamed with staff from the Water Production Department to update the city’s Drought Contingency Plan documentation. Prominent reminders of the city’s current Phase 2 status have been added to our website, linking to a new, handy chart with detailed information about the city’s plan (pictured here). Additional drought contingency documentation is in the works, as well as media engagements to help spread the word about the importance of water conservation.
- Since May 5, the city’s official Twitter account, @TheColonyTexas, has seen a net increase of 20 new followers, bringing the total to 756. Since the previous count, social media moderators have sent out 42 unique Tweets promoting city news, events and other information relevant to the city’s residents.
- The city’s official Facebook page has accumulated a net total of 36 new “Likes,” or followers since the last update, bringing the total to 2,284. Facebook metrics indicated followers were particularly interested in: an article published by *The Dallas Business Journal* on May 28 with the headline, “Nebraska Furniture Mart readying to hit DFW by storm;” updated listings of employment opportunities with the city; and photos from the opening of Bridges Cemetery on Memorial Day for tours by members of the library’s Local History Committee.

Drought Contingency Guide



The City of The Colony partners with its neighbors in a regional water conservation alliance, which has been established to protect our natural resources during extreme drought periods, thereby ensuring adequate water supplies are available for residents and businesses. Drought contingency plans are enacted to specify the criteria and procedures for declaring a water emergency and implementing response phases in accordance with the Texas Administrative Code and the city’s contracts with its water providers.

- The city’s official website has been undergoing a significant host migration in recent weeks. The Communications Department has been assisting Information Technology staff members troubleshooting the migration to help ensure the integrity of the site’s content and functionality is maintained.
- As matter of routine, the Communications Department also promotes via social media and other methods of communication: voting times and locations for local and school district elections; construction progress at the Nebraska Furniture Mart site; weekly updates from the city manager’s office to the city council; job opportunities available with the city; notification of agenda postings for the City Council and the Planning and Zoning Commission; and weather and traffic alerts.

For the month of May the department closed 59 helpdesk tickets. The deployment of new computers to the library was completed as well as to all three fire stations. We still have 10 of the 80 computers purchased this year left to deploy.

Migration of the city's main website is taking longer than planned as we work thru program changes from a Windows web server to a Linux-based server. We have completed redesign of the majority of the Microsoft .ASP functions which are currently in place on the hosting company's servers that we are migrating from. We hope to have the remaining functions redesigned and final migration completed by June 13.

Council approved purchasing of new Toughbook laptops and tablets for the police and fire departments. The orders will be placed this week with expected delivery in mid to late July. The next project will be to implement multi-factor authentication for CJIS (Criminal Justice Information Systems) compliance.

The following list of projects and tasks in which the I.T. department is involved in.

- Projects: Updates from ongoing projects
- Assist police department in upgrading their CAD system (New World Systems). The vendor is scheduled to be onsite June 16 for installation of new software.
- Assist fire department in deploying new module in PD CAD system (New World Systems).
- Implement multi-factor authentication in the police department to meet CJIS requirements.
- Upgrade phone systems hardware and software throughout the city. An RFP is scheduled to be posted the week of June 16.
- Complete moving files from retired servers and storage to new locations.
- Reallocate drive usage on old network storage system after moving primary data to new network storage system.
- Retire all Windows 2000 servers (PD, PARD, and DMZ) for security purposes. New hardware was purchased and deployment has been started.
- Update all firewall software to latest version (contractor). We will meet with several vendors to discuss this project and expect proposals by the June 13.
- Update all internal network switches software and review configurations for possible routing issues (contractor).
- Perform Active Directory audits of all Windows forests/domains to remove orphaned user and computer accounts. (contractor).
- Create wireless VLAN for mobile devices throughout the city.

The Technology Board did not meet during the month of June.

The Colony Utility Department has added a new payment feature to add ease and convenience for the residents and businesses. Credit card auto draft has become a very popular means of payment for the monthly water bill. There is no fee to use this service. The bill amount is charged to the credit card each month on the due date. Residents will continue to receive the monthly bill for review, the payment will be automatic. Enrollment is simple: email the request to enroll into credit card auto draft with a copy of your driver license and a phone number to: utilityadmin@thecolonytx.gov. A Customer Service Representative will contact the enrollee to obtain the credit card information and enter the information into a secure 'vault'. Those interested in enrolling can also visit us at City Hall, 6800 Main St., The Colony, TX, 75056. Provide driver license and credit card (Master Card/Visa) to be drafted. As a reminder when enrolled in the credit card draft: if the card has expired or the resident receives a new card number, inform the Utility Department with the new information so there is no interruption in the auto draft.

In addition to the credit card draft, The Colony Utility also offers payment acceptance through an IVR (automated phone payment), through the City's website, bank draft (checking/savings), night deposit, as well as in-office payments and regular mail. Automated phone payments are accepted at 972-625-2741 option #4, no fee and accepted 24/7. Web payments are accepted at <https://www.municipalonlinepayments.com/thecolonytx>, fee of \$1.25 and accepted 24/7. Any resident that would like more information on any of these payment options is encouraged to visit our website at www.thecolonytx.gov or call at 972-625-2741. The Customer Services Department is continually researching additional convenient options for our residents regarding the water utility. Stay tuned for future developments!
