High water preparedness update

THE COLONY, Texas — Emergency management officials with the City of The Colony maintain continuous contact with the [Denton County Office of Emergency Management](#) while also monitoring information provided by the [Army Corps of Engineers](#) and the [National Weather Service](#) in regards to high water levels on Lewisville Lake. We are making every effort to be prepared in the event conditions worsen.

Among data being monitored closely are the current lake elevations and weather forecast. In order to help keep our residents prepared as well, we will provide daily updates of that data and other relevant information here on our website. All data shown is for the date of the release noted above. *You may need to refresh your browser for the latest version.*

Lake Levels	534.46 feet (12.46 feet above normal)
Lake release data	7,041 cubic feet per second (cfs)
Weather Forecast (today)	A 20-percent chance of showers and thunderstorms. Mostly sunny, with a high near 93. Heat index values as high as 97. A 20-percent chance of showers and thunderstorms before 8 p.m. Partly cloudy tonight, with a low around 76.
Weather Forecast (tomorrow)	Mostly sunny, with a high near 94. Heat index values as high as 99. Partly cloudy at night, with a low around 76.
