**Boil Water Notice Rescinded
July 18th 2017**

On July 16th 2017, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality required the City of The Colony public water system, (PWS ID 0610081), to issue a Boil Water Notice to inform customers, individuals, or employees that due to conditions which occurred recently in the public water system, the water from this public water system was required to be boiled prior to use for drinking water or human consumption purposes.

The public water system has taken the necessary corrective actions to restore the quality of the water distributed by this public water system used for drinking water or human consumption purposes and has provided TCEQ with laboratory test results that indicate that the water no longer requires boiling prior to use as of July 18th 2017.

The Water Production Department collected bacteriological samples from four different points within the Tribute subdivision on Monday July 17th 2017. Those samples were taken to a state NELAP-accredited laboratory of the City of Lewisville's. The results of all four samples were Total Coliform Not Found. Coliform are indicator bacteria for the possible presence of E.coli bacteria. As a result, the Boil Water Notice has been lifted and the water is safe for human consumption.
